AUGUST 1ST TO AUGUST 7TH

1. Bank Partners with IIM-A Startup Incubator for Tech Promotion

The Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) has teamed up with the Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad's startup incubator, Center for Innovation, Incubation & Entrepreneurship. Their goal is to promote Deep Tech and science-led Innovation by providing startup companies with access to initial capital. The objective is to support startups with innovative ideas and technologies that are important for India's self-reliance goals by 2047.

2. Growth in India's Core Sectors for June 2023

According to data from the Ministry of Commerce, India's eight core sectors, including coal, crude oil, steel, cement, and electricity, saw a growth of 8.2 percent in June 2023. This growth is measured compared to the same period in the previous year. The core sector growth for May has been revised upwards from 4.3 percent to 5.0 percent. In June 2022, the core sector experienced a growth rate of 13.1 percent.

3. Bank Hosts Fintech Event for Innovation

Karnataka Bank hosted the inaugural edition of 'KBL - FinOne,' a fintech partnership event held in Bengaluru in July 2023. The event's aim was to create new and creative business models, offer a seamless banking experience, and present a comprehensive range of banking products. The event featured over 30 speakers from various fintech backgrounds, discussing topics like emerging lending models and neo-banks.

4. Rise in GST Revenues for July 2023

The Finance Ministry reported that the gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenues for July 2023 are 11% higher compared to July 2022. This marks the fifth time that the gross GST collection has surpassed Rs 1.65 lakh crore. After regular settlement, the total revenue for CGST in July 2023 was Rs 69,558 crore, and for SGST, it was Rs 70,811 crore.

5. GST Rate for Casinos and Online Gaming

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced that a GST rate of 28 percent will be applied to casinos and online gaming entry fees starting from October 1st. This rate will be applicable to the amount paid at the entry level for online gaming. The GST Council recommended amendments to the CGST Act 2017 and IGST Act 2017 to provide clarity on the taxation of supplies in casinos, horse racing, and online gaming.

6. India's GDP Growth Projection

S&P (S&P Global, a rating agency) predicts that India's gross domestic product (GDP) will grow at a rate of 6.7% per year from fiscal year 2024 to FY 2031. This growth is projected to increase India's GDP from \$3.4 trillion in fiscal year 2023 to \$6.7 trillion. S&P Global also expects the per capita GDP to rise to around \$4,500. The main driver of this growth is capital accumulation, with investment as a percentage of GDP reaching a 10-year high of 34% in fiscal 2023.

7. Sebi Cancels Stock Broker Registration

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has canceled the registration of Metals and Minerals Trading Corp of India (MMTC) Ltd. as a stock broker in August 2023. The reason behind this decision is MMTC's involvement in illegal "paired contracts" related to the now-defunct National Spot Exchange Ltd (NSEL) in August 2023. Sebi directed MMTC to allow existing clients to withdraw or transfer their securities or funds held by the company within 15 days.

8. Market Valuation Erosion for Top Firms

The combined market valuation of seven out of the top-10 most valued companies decreased by Rs 1,09,947.86 crore in the first week of August 2023. The State Bank of India (SBI) experienced the largest decline in valuation due to a weak trend in the stock market. SBI's valuation fell by Rs 38,197.34 crore to Rs 5,11,603.38 crore. During the first week of August 2023, the BSE benchmark dropped by 438.95 points or 0.66 percent. However, Tata Consultancy Services, HDFC Bank, and Infosys observed an increase in their market capitalization.

9. SBI's Strong Financial Results

In the April-June quarter of 2023-24, the State Bank of India (SBI) reported a significant increase in quarterly profit to ₹16,884 crore, compared to ₹6,068 crore in the same quarter of 2022. Additionally, the net income more than doubled to ₹18,537 crore from ₹7,325 crore in 2022. However, there was a slight decline in net interest income.

Obituaries:

1. Marathi Poet Namdeo Dhondo Mahanor Passes Away

Namdeo Dhondo Mahanor, a respected Marathi poet, has passed away. He gained popularity for his poetry that captured the essence of nature. He also contributed songs to classic Marathi movies like "Jait Re Jait," "Ek Hota Vidushak," and "Sarja." He received the Padma Shri, the fourth-highest civilian award in India, for his literary contributions. He had also served as a member of the state legislative council.

2. Demise of Former IAS Officer N Vittal

N Vittal, a former IAS officer, passed away in Chennai. He served as the Telecom Secretary and Central Vigilance Commissioner (CVC). While chairing the Telecom Commission, he initiated the process of liberalization in the telecom sector.

3. Demise of Folk Singer Gaddar

Folk singer Gaddar, who passed away in Hyderabad, was widely recognized for his contributions. He played a significant role in people's movements during the Naxal movement in combined Andhra Pradesh. His iconic song "Podustunna Poddu Meeda Nadustunna Kaalama Poru Telanganama" became synonymous with the Telangana agitation, showcasing his involvement in the Telangana cause.

IMPORTANT DAYS:

1. World Wide Web Day

World Wide Web Day is celebrated on August 1st each year. The day highlights the significance of the web in improving people's lives through enhanced communication, access to information, education, and empowerment. The World Wide Web was created between 1989 and 1993 by Sir Tim Berners-Lee at CERN (the European Organization for Nuclear Research).

2. Muslim Women's Rights Day

Muslim Women's Rights Day is observed on August 1st across India. This day commemorates the enactment of a law against triple talaq on August 1, 2019. The law criminalized the practice of instant triple talaq, aiming to strengthen the self-reliance, self-respect, and self-confidence of Muslim women and protect their constitutional, fundamental, and democratic rights.

3. National Handloom Day

National Handloom Day is celebrated on August 7th. The day pays tribute to the extensive handloom community in India for their dedication to preserving traditional heritage and ensuring financial stability. It also commemorates the Swadeshi Movement's beginnings in Bengal, promoting the use of Indian-made goods and boycotting foreign products.

4. World Breastfeeding Week

World Breastfeeding Week begins on August 1st and concludes on August 7th. The week emphasizes the importance of regular breastfeeding for the healthy development of infants. The 2023 theme is "Let's make breastfeeding and work, work!"

5. Aadi Perukku in Tamil Nadu

Tamil Nadu's cultural community celebrates Aadi Perukku, also known as Pathinettam Perukku. This auspicious festival, observed on August 3rd, honors the monsoon season and the fertility of the soil.

6. World Lung Cancer Day

World Lung Cancer Day is observed on August 1st every year. It was established to raise awareness about lung cancer and encourage more research to break the stigma surrounding the disease.

NEW APPOINTMENTS:

1. BRICS New Development Bank Appointment

Thuraiya Hamid Alhashmi has been elected as a member of the Board of Directors and a Constituency Director at BRICS' New Development Bank. She is the first Emirati and Arab woman to hold this position, contributing to global financial interests and various sectors.

2. Corporate Vice President of Microsoft India

Puneet Chandok has been appointed as the Corporate Vice President of Microsoft India and South Asia. He is responsible for integrating Microsoft's operations across South Asian countries and focusing on key industries using generative AI technology.

3. Extension of Cabinet Secretary's Tenure

Rajiv Gauba's tenure as Cabinet Secretary has been extended by one year. This marks his third extension in the same position, recognizing his contributions and expertise.

IMPORTANT NEWS – INDIA:

1. G20 EMPOWER Summit

Union Minister for Women and Child Development Smriti Zubin Irani will inaugurate the G20 EMPOWER Summit in Gandhinagar. The theme is "Women-Led Development," aiming to accelerate women's leadership and empowerment in the private sector across G20 countries.

2. National Digital Nagrik Forum (NDNF)

The Confederation of All India Traders introduced the National Digital Nagrik Forum (NDNF) to advance the rights of traders, consumers, and society. It aims to boost the digital trade economy and focuses on themes like consumer protection and online safety.

3. Earth's Plastic Overshoot Day

Earth Action has noted Earth's first Plastic Overshoot Day, signifying the point at which plastic consumption exceeds global waste management capacity. India is among the top contributors to mismanaged plastic waste.

4. National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction

The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment launched the National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction. The plan aims to raise awareness about substance use and provide support and treatment facilities.

5. Digital Crop Survey in 12 States

The government launched a digital crop survey on a pilot basis in 12 states during the Kharif season. This initiative aims to provide accurate crop sowing data for better planning and development of solutions.

6. Unemployment Rate Data

According to the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy, the total unemployment rate in India decreased to 7.95% in July 2023 from 8.45% in June 2023. Rural unemployment declined due to increased demand for laborers in farming, while urban unemployment slightly increased.

7. Launch of e-CARe Portal

The government will launch the e-CARe (e-Clearance for Afterlife Remains) portal to facilitate the swift transfer of mortal remains of Indians who die abroad. The portal aims to avoid delays during transportation and streamline the process.

8. Utkarsh and Unmesh Festival

President Draupadi Murmu inaugurated the national festival "Utkarsh" and the international literature festival "Unmesh" in Bhopal. The events celebrate folk and tribal expressions as well as literature, with participants from 15 countries attending the Unmesh festival.

9. Launch of Study in India (SII) Portal

Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan and External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar jointly introduced the Study in India (SII) portal in New Delhi. The portal aims to simplify the academic journey of international students in India. It provides comprehensive information about Indian Higher Education Institutions and offers an integrated platform for student registration and visa application. Additionally, it offers details about academic facilities and research support.

10. Launch of 'Rajmargyatra' Mobile Application

The National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) launched the 'Rajmargyatra' mobile application, designed to provide a user-friendly experience for highway users. The app focuses on enhancing the travel experience by providing real-time weather updates, timely notifications, and information about nearby toll plazas, petrol stations, and hospitals.

11. Launch of PHO Module under Sagar Setu - National Logistics Portal (Marine)

Sarbananda Sonowal, the Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways and Ayush, inaugurated the Port Health Organisation (PHO) module under the Sagar Setu - National Logistics Portal (Marine). The initiative aims to streamline operations, promote Ease of Doing Business (EODB), and ensure the health and safety of citizens and port workers. This technology-driven module conducts disease surveillance, health inspections, and quarantine measures.

12. Prohibition of 'Ketoprofen' and 'Aceclofenac'

The production, sale, and distribution of 'ketoprofen' and 'aceclofenac,' along with their formulations, for animal use have been prohibited. The Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare issued this notification under section 26A of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940. The ban was recommended by the Drugs Technical Advisory Board (DTAB), the apex authority for drug-related decisions in India.

13. Manufacturing of Vande Bharat Trains by RVNL

Rail Vikas Nigam Ltd (RVNL) is partnering with Russian company Metrowagonmash to manufacture and supply around 120 Vande Bharat trains to Indian Railways. The project costs ₹120 crore per train. RVNL aims to have a major share of 69%, leaving 26% for Metrowagonmash and 5% for Locomotive Electronic Systems. These air-conditioned trains will be produced in a railway factory in Maharashtra.

14. Approval of Outlay for BharatNet Project

The Cabinet approved an outlay of ₹1.39 lakh crore for BharatNet, the government's project to provide last-mile connectivity to 6.4 lakh villages across the country. This project aims to ensure broadband connectivity to all gram panchayats in India and is one of the largest rural telecom initiatives globally.

15. Imposition of Anti-Dumping Duty on Optical Fibre Imports

The Finance Ministry imposed definitive anti-dumping duty on certain optical fibre imports from China, South Korea, and Indonesia. This measure aims to support the domestic optical fibre industry, which has been impacted by low-price and low-quality imports. The anti-dumping duty ranges from \$122 per kfkm to \$857.23 per kfkm, with the commodity being traded in fkm (fibre kilometres).

16. Implementation of Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana

The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment is implementing the Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana in August 2023. The scheme aims to provide assisted living devices to senior citizens suffering from age-related disabilities or infirmities. Assessment camps by ALIMCO identify beneficiaries requiring aids and appliances to restore near-normal bodily functions.

17. Dues to States under MGNREGS

Minister of State for the Ministry Of Rural Development, Sadhvi Niranjan Jyoti, stated that the Centre owes Rs 6,366 crore in dues to states and Union Territories under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS). West Bengal has the highest amount owed, which is Rs 2,770 crore. MGNREGS ensures livelihood security by providing wage employment to unskilled workers in rural areas.

18. Monitoring App for Child Care Institutions

The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights developed the Monitoring App for Seamless Inspection (MASI) to facilitate real-time monitoring of Child Care Institutions (CCIs). This application aims to improve the effectiveness of the inspection mechanism outlined in the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015, and enhance the monitoring process.

19. Licensing Requirement for IT Hardware Imports

Starting from November 1, 2023, a valid license will be required for the import of laptops, tablets, and personal computers. The Directorate General of Foreign Trade has prepared an online portal for companies or traders to apply for the license. This move follows the notification of the Production Linked Incentive Scheme 2.0 for IT Hardware.

20. Inaugural World Coffee Conference in Bengaluru

India is set to host its first World Coffee Conference, organized by the International Coffee Organization (ICO), in Bengaluru. The ICO is a global intergovernmental organization promoting coffee trade and collaboration among coffee-producing and consuming nations. Tennis player Rohan Bopanna will endorse the event as its brand ambassador.

21. MoU between TRAI and Centre for Development of Telematics

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) and the Centre for Development of Telematics have signed an MoU to foster technical and institutional cooperation in telecommunications. This partnership aims to advance policy research, regulatory studies, and knowledge dissemination about upcoming technologies in the telecom and broadcasting sectors.

22. CSR Support for Divyangjans by NHPC

The National Hydroelectric Power Corporation Limited (NHPC) signed an MoU with the Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India (ALIMCO) to provide CSR support for distributing aids and assistive devices to around 1,000 Divyangjans (Persons with Disabilities) near NHPC Projects in North and North Eastern states.

23. Promotion of Football at Grassroots Level

The Subroto Mukherjee Sports Education Society (SMSES) signed an MoU with the All India Football Federation (AIFF) to promote football at the grassroots level. SMSES will form a Subroto XI team under Junior Boys (Under-17) and participate in AIFF Youth Competitions. Workshops for coaches will also be organized to enhance their skills and knowledge.

24. MoUs for Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan and e-Vidya in Arunachal Pradesh

The Arunachal Pradesh state government signed two MoUs with the Union education ministry for the implementation of the Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan and the Pradhan Mantri e-Vidya in New Delhi. These initiatives aim to enhance the quality of higher education and digital learning in the state.

25. Establishment of India 5G Testbed by IIT Madras and Ministry of Railways

The Ministry of Railways and IIT Madras signed an MoU to establish the India 5G testbed at the Indian Railway Institute of Signal Engineering and Telecommunications (IRISET). The testbed aims to enhance operational efficiency, passenger experience, and safety by conducting trials of 5G-enabled applications tailored for railway operations.

Highlights of RBI's August 2023 Monetary Policy Meeting The highlights of the Reserve Bank of India's August 2023 Monetary Policy meeting encompass the RBI's decisions, economic assessments, inflation forecasts, and policy measures discussed during the gathering.

- 1. **Unchanged Repo Rate at 6.5%:** The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) upheld the repo rate at 6.50% during its August 2023 monetary policy meeting. The unanimous decision was reached by the six-member Monetary Policy Committee (MPC).
- 2. **Inflation Trends and Projections:** After dipping to 4.3% in May 2023, headline inflation experienced an upswing in June and is anticipated to climb further in July and August due to elevated vegetable prices. The RBI has forecasted India's Q2 retail inflation at 6.2%, Q3 at 5.7%, and Q4 at 5.2% for the ongoing fiscal year. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation projection for FY2023-24 has been adjusted from 5.1% to 5.4% due to shocks in vegetable prices.
- 3. **Economic Outlook:** Despite frail external demand, domestic economic activity remains robust and is poised to sustain its momentum. The RBI maintained the GDP growth projection for the fiscal year at 6.5%, with balanced risks.
- 4. **Monitoring Inflation Trajectory:** The MPC remains committed to aligning inflation with the 4% target and anchoring inflation expectations. The cumulative 250-basis point rate hike implemented by the MPC is gradually impacting the economy. The MPC opted for vigilance and a thorough assessment of the evolving situation before contemplating policy adjustments.
- 5. **Liquidity Measures:** The RBI directed banks to maintain an incremental cash reserve ratio of 10% on deposit growth between May 19 and July 28, effective from the August 12 fortnight.
- 6. **UPI Payment Enhancements:** The RBI introduced modifications to UPI payments, enabling offline transactions using near-field communication. The payment limit for UPI Lite has been raised from Rs 200 to Rs 500.
- 7. **Transition to Fixed-Rate Regime:** The RBI's directive permits home loan and other borrowers to transition to a fixed-rate regime.
- 8. **Consistent Policy Stance:** This marks the third consecutive monetary policy meeting in which the MPC opted to maintain the repo rate at 6.50%. Previously, the MPC had raised the repo rate by 250 basis points from May 2022 to February 2023.
- 9. **Positive Outlook for Indian Economy:** RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das acknowledged that the Indian economy continues to shine as a beacon in the global landscape.

Conversational Payments on UPI: In a move aimed at enhancing the convenience and accessibility of UPI, the RBI has disclosed plans to introduce Conversational Payments on the platform. This innovative feature empowers users to

engage in transactions through interactions with an AI-powered system, ensuring the utmost safety and security throughout the process.

- **Enhanced Accessibility:** The integration of AI-driven conversational capabilities is set to make UPI even more user-friendly, reducing adoption barriers, particularly among senior citizens and individuals with disabilities.
- **Multilingual Support:** Initially available in Hindi and English, the Conversational Payments feature will subsequently encompass a range of Indian languages, catering to the linguistic diversity of the nation.

UPI Lite Payment Limit Enhancement: Recognizing the evolving requirements of users, the RBI has raised the transaction limit for UPI Lite from Rs 200 to Rs 500, aiming to facilitate more substantial and convenient transactions.

- Enhanced Processing: UPI Lite, introduced by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), enables swift small-value transactions by optimizing processing resources for banks. This enhancement reduces transaction failures and improves overall efficiency.
- Balancing Security: While the transaction limit has been increased, the balance ceiling for UPI Lite remains
 unchanged at Rs 2,000. This cautious approach ensures that two-factor authentication remains in place for
 higher transaction limits.

Offline UPI Payments with NFC Technology: In a move to bolster the adoption of UPI Lite, the RBI is introducing offline payments using Near Field Communication (NFC) technology. This innovative approach not only facilitates retail digital payments in scenarios of weak or absent internet connectivity but also ensures speed and minimal transaction declines.

- Addressing Connectivity Challenges: The incorporation of NFC technology allows users to conduct transactions even when internet or telecom connectivity is compromised, ensuring more reliable and accessible digital payments.
- Seamless Transactions: Utilizing NFC technology not only mitigates connectivity issues but also guarantees smoother and more efficient transactions, enhancing UPI Lite's appeal as a dependable digital payment solution.

National Affairs

- 1. On August 5, 2023, marks four years since the revocation of Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir. This move by the Indian Government on August 5, 2019, abolished the region's special status, aiming to transform and revitalize 1,309 railway stations across India through the Amrit Bharat Station Scheme (ABSS). The goal is to enhance the passenger experience and create world-class travel hubs.
- 2. Following recommendations from the Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR), anti-dumping duties have been imposed on Dispersion Unshifted Single-Mode Optical Fiber (SMOF) imports from China, South Korea, and Indonesia by the revenue department.
- 3. Complaints have been raised by Jaydeep Dhankar, the Chairman of Rajya Sabha, against prominent opposition members Derek O'Brien from TMC and Raghav Chadha from Aam Aadmi Party. The complaints relate to alleged breaches of parliamentary privileges, contributing to the ongoing political tensions.
- 4. The Union Cabinet has approved the final phase of the BharatNet project, which aims to provide optical fiber-based broadband connectivity to 6.4 lakh villages across India. With a budget of Rs 1.39 lakh crore, the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) seeks to achieve this connectivity within the next two and a half years.
- 5. The Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi (Amendment) Bill, 2023, also known as the Delhi Services Bill, has been passed with 131 votes in favor and 102 against in Rajya Sabha. This bill aims to replace an existing ordinance and addresses conflicts between the Aam Aadmi Party and the Central Government.
- 6. The Atal Pension Yojana (APY) scheme has completed eight successful years of implementation, enrolling over 5.25 crore subscribers.
- 7. Union Health & Family Welfare Minister, Mansukh Mandaviya, announced the target to eliminate Lymphatic Filariasis by 2027 during the inauguration of the second phase of the Annual Nationwide Mass Drug Administration (MDA) initiative.

- 8. Chief Justice of India (CJI) D.Y Chandrachud introduced the 'SuSwagatam' portal, providing a convenient platform for advocates, litigants, and citizens to obtain QR code-based ePasses for entry to the Supreme Court.
- 9. The Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) has replaced the Standing Committee on Economic Statistics (SCES) with the more comprehensive Standing Committee on Statistics (SCoS), responsible for reviewing surveys conducted by the National Statistical Office (NSO).
- 10. As part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) initiative, Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar flagged off the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' motorcycle rally, encouraging individuals to display the national flag at their residences from August 13 to 15.
- 11. India is ambitiously aiming to increase its current 6% share of natural gas in its energy mix to 15% by 2030, led by Rameswar Teli, the Minister of State in the Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas.

- 4. In a notable stride towards accessible and affordable healthcare, Goa has taken the lead among Indian states by introducing free In vitro fertilization (IVF) treatment. This groundbreaking initiative, coupled with assisted reproductive technology (ART) and intrauterine insemination (IUI), was inaugurated by Chief Minister Pramod Sawant at the Goa Medical College (GMC) in Bambolim.

These reforms aim to provide greater clarity in resetting interest rates, offer borrowers the option to switch to fixed interest rates, and prevent banks from unilaterally changing the loan tenure without proper consent.

- The Central Government has granted final approval for a pivotal project aimed at enhancing the operational
 capabilities of the Indian Navy. The project involves the construction of five fleet support ships, designed to
 play a vital role in replenishing warships with essential supplies, including fuel, food, and ammunition, during
 missions.
- To commemorate 75 years of Independence, several Air Force Stations in and around Delhi celebrated the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) from August 9 to 15, 2023. The events were coordinated under the 'Meri Maati Mera Desh Campaign,' initiated by the Government of India as part of the ongoing AKAM celebrations.

The inaugural WHO Traditional Medicine Global Summit is scheduled to take place on August 17 and 18, 2023, in Gandhinagar, Gujarat, India. This event will coincide with the G20 health ministerial meeting, creating a platform to enhance political commitment and evidence-based actions in the field of traditional medicine, which serves as an initial recourse for millions worldwide.

Sports News:

- 1. Brazil forward Neymar Jr has completed a move to Saudi Arabia's Al-Hilal from Paris Saint-Germain (PSG), joining the likes of Cristiano Ronaldo and Karim Benzema. Neymar, 31, scored 118 goals in 173 matches for PSG over six injury-plagued seasons.
- 2. The Tamil Nadu government, in collaboration with Racing Promotions Private Limited (RRPL), has introduced a new street circuit in Chennai. The 3.5km track around the Island Grounds will be the first-ever street circuit in India and South Asia to host a night race.
- 3. Sri Lankan all-rounder Wanindu Hasaranga has announced his retirement from Test cricket. The 26-year-old has decided to focus on his limited-overs career, where he plays a pivotal role for Sri Lanka.
- 4. Pakistan fast bowler Wahab Riaz has declared his retirement from international cricket, bringing a 15-year career to a close. The 38-year-old represented Pakistan in 27 Tests, 91 ODIs, and 36 T20Is, claiming a total of 237 wickets.
- 5. Indian sprinter Dutee Chand, renowned as India's fastest female athlete and holder of the national 100m record, has faced a significant setback with a four-year ban following her failure in an out-of-competition dope test. The test revealed the presence of selective androgen receptor modulators (SARMs), leading to her suspension from competitive sports.
- 6. Adille Sumariwalla has been elected as one of the four vice presidents of World Athletics, the highest position ever held by an Indian in the global track and field governing body. The 65-year-old Sumariwalla, president of the Athletics Federation of India (AFI), received the third-highest number of votes during the WA elections held in Budapest, Hungary. He will serve a four-year term.

Schemes and Committees News

- The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), India's primary advisory body for school education, has taken a significant step towards revising textbooks. A 19-member committee has been formed by the council to align school syllabi, textbooks, teaching materials, and learning resources with the National Curriculum Framework (NCF). The committee's responsibility spans from Classes 3 to 12 and aims to ensure a smooth progression from Classes 1 and 2 to higher grades.
- The Vishwakarma Yojana, announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his Independence Day speech, has led to the introduction of a scheme aimed at enhancing the livelihood prospects of traditional artisans and craftspeople. The Union Cabinet has promptly approved the scheme, underscoring its dedication to promoting and safeguarding traditional skills and crafts.

- The Ministry of Education has launched the Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (PM-USHA), a central initiative focused on improving access, equity, and excellence in higher education across States and Union Territories. However, the requirement to adhere to certain academic criteria for funding under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has sparked controversy, potentially excluding certain institutions from the scheme.
- The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) in India has taken a proactive stance in promoting gender equality within the aviation sector. On August 10, 2023, the DGCA established a four-member committee comprised of senior officials to formulate strategies and recommendations for achieving gender parity in the industry. The committee's goal is to propose actionable measures that the DGCA can implement to foster gender equality in aviation.
- The cabinet has approved the extension of the Digital India project, allocating a substantial budget of ₹14,903 crore. Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw announced this decision, emphasizing that the extended initiative will build upon the achievements of its previous phase.
- In a significant move to empower women and spur economic growth, the Indian government has introduced the 'Lakhpati Didi' scheme, aiming to provide skill training to two crore women nationwide. Originally implemented in select states, the scheme now seeks to expand its impact on a national scale.
- The Maharashtra government is taking a significant step towards improving connectivity and the lives of tribal communities. The Bhagwan Birsa Munda Jodaraste Scheme aims to connect all tribal villages in 17 districts of Maharashtra with main roads, addressing challenges these communities face in accessing essential services. The project, with an estimated cost of Rs 5,000 crore, involves building approximately 6,838 kilometers of roads.

Science and Technology News

- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is launching its inaugural solar mission, Aditya-L1, to study the Sun. The mission will orbit around the Lagrange point 1 (L1), approximately 1.5 million kilometers from Earth. Aditya-L1 will study the Sun's atmosphere, magnetic fields, and space weather impacts from this advantageous location.
- The Korea Advanced Institute of Science & Technology (KAIST) is making groundbreaking strides in aviation with the development of "Pibot," a humanoid robot designed to fly aircraft using advanced AI capabilities. Pibot's ability to manipulate flight instruments, understand complex manuals, and respond swiftly to emergencies holds potential to revolutionize aviation and other industries.
- Chennai-based Agnikul Cosmos has initiated the integration of its innovative launch vehicle, Agnibaan SOrTeD (Sub-Orbital Technological Demonstrator), with its private launchpad at the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota. While the exact launch date remains undisclosed, this milestone signifies Agnikul Cosmos's progress in space innovation.

It propels India into an exclusive league of spacefaring nations and advances its aspiration to play a pivotal role in the global space race.
- Chandrayaan-3's mission objectives encompass the collection of vital data from the lunar south pole, believed to be rich in water ice. This information holds the potential to support future human endeavors on the moon's surface. Additionally, the mission is expected to enhance our comprehension of the moon's formation and evolution.
- This successful landing marks a proud juncture for India and a significant stride in our voyage through space. I am confident that this mission will pave the way for numerous accomplishments in the years ahead.
- Chandrayaan-3: The Team behind India's Lunar Success The Indian spacecraft, Chandrayaan-3, has attained a significant feat with its gentle landing on the moon's surface. The touchdown occurred at 6:04 pm on August 23, 2023, in line with the schedule. This achievement has established India as the fourth nation, alongside the United States, China, and the former Soviet Union, to master the intricate technology of soft lunar landings. Notably, nearly 54 female engineers and scientists were integral to the Chandrayaan-3 mission. They held key roles as associate and deputy project directors, as well as project managers for various systems.
- Key Individuals Behind Chandrayaan-3: S Somanath ISRO Chairman At the forefront of India's ambitious lunar mission is ISRO chief S Somanath. He is also credited with accelerating ISRO's other pivotal missions, including Gaganyaan and the Aditya-L1 solar mission. Somanath's leadership was previously instrumental as the director of the Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) and the Liquid Propulsion Systems Centre, which are the primary establishments for ISRO's rocket technology development.
- P Veeramuthuvel Chandrayaan-3 Project Director Heading the latest lunar touchdown endeavor is P
 Veeramuthuvel, the project director of Chandrayaan-3. Taking on this role in 2019, he was previously a
 deputy director in the Space Infrastructure Programme Office at ISRO headquarters. Veeramuthuvel's
 technical expertise is widely recognized, and he played a pivotal role in Chandrayaan-2, particularly in
 negotiations with NASA. Hailing from Villupuram in Tamil Nadu, he is an alumnus of the Indian Institute of
 Technology Madras (IIT-M).
- S Mohana Kumar, a senior scientist from the Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre, assumes the role of mission director for Chandrayaan-3. Kumar was responsible for overseeing the successful commercial launch of the One Web India 2 satellites during the LVM3-M3 mission.
- S Unnikrishnan Nair, Director of the Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) S Unnikrishnan Nair leads the Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) located in Thumba, Thiruvananthapuram district, Kerala. - 1. Neeraj Chopra achieved a historic milestone by securing the gold medal in the men's javelin throw event at the 2023 World Athletics Championships in Budapest, Hungary, with a remarkable throw of 88.17 meters. This remarkable achievement made him the first-ever Indian athlete to claim the gold at this prestigious event, marking a significant moment in Indian athletics. Neeraj faced tough competition, especially from Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem, who secured the silver medal with an impressive throw of 87.82 meters.
- 2. Union Home Minister Amit Shah chaired the 26th meeting of the Western Zonal Council (WZC) in Gandhinagar. The primary objective of this meeting was to foster cooperation and collaboration among the states through regular dialogue and discussions. This event was organized by the Inter-State Council Secretariat, under the Ministry of Home Affairs, in partnership with the Government of Gujarat. The Western Zonal Council includes the states of Gujarat, Goa, Maharashtra, as well as the Union Territories of Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu.
- 3. The Indian Air Force (IAF) participated in Exercise BRIGHT STAR-23, a biennial multilateral tri-service exercise, for the first time. This exercise took place at Cairo Air Base, Egypt, from August 27 to September 16, 2023, with the aim of strengthening strategic partnerships and enhancing joint operational capabilities. The primary objective was to practice the planning and execution of joint operations. The IAF contingent included five MiG-29, two IL-78, two C-130, and two C-17 aircraft.
- 4. NASA and SpaceX successfully launched the Dragon spacecraft, carrying four astronauts, to the International Space Station (ISS). The launch took place from Launch Complex 39A at NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida. The crew of four astronauts hailed from different countries, including the United States, Denmark, Japan, and Russia. This mission, known as SpaceX Crew-7, marks the seventh commercial crew rotation mission for NASA.
- 5. India, in collaboration with the Asian Development Bank, is gearing up to establish a hub focused on climate change and health in the national capital, Delhi. The primary aim of this initiative is to foster knowledge sharing, foster partnerships, encourage innovation, and extend support to countries beyond the G-20, particularly developing nations. Recognizing the far-reaching impact of climate change, this center will serve as a platform for diverse partners to engage in critical discussions and mutual learning.
- 6. The Ministry of Education, in conjunction with the All India Council of Technical Education, has unveiled the sixth edition of the Smart India Hackathon 2023. The main objective is to showcase the burgeoning culture of innovation within India's education sector. The hackathon brings together the creative talents of India's youth to address real-world challenges faced by various government departments. Over time, it has evolved into a global model for hackathons and innovation frameworks, reflecting its dynamic growth.
- 7. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has given its approval for the merger of The Jalgaon Peoples Co-operative Bank and Akola Merchant Co-operative Bank. This move aims to streamline operations and services for customers under a unified entity, with Akola Merchant Co-operative Bank branches operating as part of The Jalgaon Peoples Co-operative Bank. Additionally, the central bank has granted approval for the merger of Twin Cities Co-operative Urban Bank Ltd and Kranti Co-operative Urban Bank Ltd.
- 8. Airtel Payments Bank, in collaboration with Frontier Markets and the Mastercard Center for Inclusive Growth, has introduced 'She Leads Bharat: Udyam,' a pioneering initiative. The goal is to empower women-owned small businesses (WOSB) by providing them with resources, tools, and opportunities to expand and diversify

their incomes. This initiative brings together the private sector and social enterprise to demonstrate a digital-first model designed to empower WOSBs to enhance their incomes.

- 9. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has increased the transaction limits for small-value digital payments in offline mode to ₹500, up from the previous cap of ₹200. This decision aims to facilitate faster, more dependable, and contactless payments for everyday small-value purchases, transit payments, and more by eliminating the need for two-factor verification for such transactions. In practical terms, this means that parties can now conduct digital transactions of up to ₹500 each in offline mode.
- 10. At the World Athletics Championships 2023, the Indian men's 4x400 meters relay team, comprised of Muhammed Anas Yahiya, Amoj Jacob, Muhammed Ajmal, and Rajesh Ramesh, secured the fifth position in the 4x400 meters relay race final. The gold medal went to the USA relay team, consisting of Quincy Hall, Vernon Norwood, Justin Robinson, and Rai Benjamin. France clinched the silver medal, while Great Britain took home the bronze.
- 11. Kunlavut Vitidsarn from Thailand made history by becoming the first Thai player to secure the men's singles title at the 2023 Badminton World Championships, earning the esteemed title of badminton world champion after triumphing over Japan's Kodai Naraoka in Copenhagen. Additionally, An Se-young, the world's topranked player, etched her name in history as the first South Korean to claim the women's singles gold at the 2023 World Championships by defeating Carolina Marin. An Se-young's remarkable journey included a straight-game victory over Tokyo 2020 gold medalist Chen Yufei in the semi-finals.
- 12. Max Verstappen, representing Red Bull Racing, clinched victory at the Dutch Grand Prix 2023 for the third consecutive year, maintaining his dominance at his home race hosted at Circuit Zandvoort in the Netherlands. This triumph also matched Sebastian Vettel's record of nine consecutive F1 victories. The second position was secured by Fernando Alonso of Aston Martin, while Pierre Gasly of Alpine took the third spot.
- 13. National Sports Day in India, celebrated every year on August 29th, commemorates the birth anniversary of the legendary hockey player Major Dhyan Chand Singh. This special day serves as a reminder to honor the remarkable contributions, unwavering determination, and outstanding achievements of athletes, highlighting their significant role in shaping societies. The theme for this year's National Sports Day celebration is "Sports are an enabler to an inclusive and fit society."
- 14. Keralites worldwide are joyously celebrating "Thiruonam" on the 10th, the most auspicious day of Onam, Kerala's largest cultural festival. Onam, the harvest festival of Kerala, represents values of prosperity, secularism, and harmony. It's a time when Keralites welcome the legendary and virtuous king Mahabali, reminiscing about the good old days. The celebration of Thiruonam is steeped in cultural traditions and glory, filling hearts with hope.
- 15. The Development Bank of Singapore (DBS) has joined forces with commodities trader Maptrasco to successfully complete the first-ever "live" transaction involving electronic Bills of Lading for shipments between Singapore and India. The primary objective is to facilitate digital trade finance for live shipments of goods between the two nations. This transaction was conducted under the TradeTrust framework, an initiative led by the Infocomm Media Development Authority and supported by Enterprise Singapore.
- 16. Yes Bank has introduced a co-branded Corporate Credit Card in partnership with the spend management platform Zaggle, offering businesses direct control over their company expenditures. This initiative aims to empower businesses to re-imagine their payment processes, streamline reconciliation, and efficiently manage corporate expenses. It includes features such as setting individual spending limits, implementing merchant category restrictions, and applying various controls.
- 17. Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has increased the financial aid provided to women under the Ladli Behna scheme from Rs 1,000 to Rs 1,250 per month. Furthermore, he announced a 35 percent reservation for women in government jobs and provided gas cylinders at the cost of Rs 450. The Ladli

- Behna scheme offers monthly financial assistance to women aged 23 to 60 who do not pay income taxes and come from families earning less than Rs 2.5 lakh annually.
- 18. The Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) has partnered with Saraswat Cooperative Bank Ltd to enhance the penetration of life insurance through the Bancassurance channel in Mumbai. Saraswat Cooperative Bank is India's largest Urban Cooperative Bank. This partnership enables the bank's customers and citizens in general to fulfill their life insurance protection needs by purchasing LIC insurance products directly through the bank.
- 19. Indian athlete Parul Chaudhary made a remarkable achievement at the World Athletics Championships 2023 in Budapest, Hungary. She finished in the eleventh position in the 3000 meters steeplechase final and, in the process, broke the national record. This achievement also secured her a spot in the Paris Olympics 2024. The gold medal in the steeplechase was won by Brunei's Winfred Mutile Yavi, with Kenya's Beatrice Chepkoech claiming silver and another Kenyan athlete, Faith Cherotich, taking home the bronze.
- 20. Eminent poet and writer Jayanta Mahapatra passed away at the age of 95. He was the first Indian poet to receive a Sahitya Akademi award for English poetry and was also honored with the Padma Shri in 2009. Notably, he returned the Padma Shri in 2015 as a protest against "rising intolerance in India." Jayanta Mahapatra is best known for his iconic poems like "Indian Summer" and "Hunger," which are considered classics in modern Indian English literature.
- 21. Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin inaugurated the expansion of the state government's breakfast scheme in Thirukkuvalai. This expansion benefits 17 lakh students across 31,000 government schools in the state. Initially designed to provide nutritious breakfast to 1,14,095 students in classes 1 to 5 across 1,545 government schools, the scheme has received an allocation of Rs 33.56 crore for its expansion.
- 22. The Maharashtra Government has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Germany's professional association football league, 'Bundesliga,' with the aim of establishing a football team for players under the age of 14. The primary objective is to nurture young football talent, helping them develop their skills and potentially compete at a high level. The Bundesliga is renowned as Germany's premier professional football league and one of the leading leagues in Europe.
- 23. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, in collaboration with IIT Bombay and Shakti Sustainable Energy Foundation, launched HSBC India's strategic partnerships to drive innovation in green hydrogen. This initiative is aimed at reducing carbon intensity in the economy and fostering the creation of green job opportunities. Green hydrogen is seen as a crucial element in countering climate change and advancing towards a low-carbon and self-reliant economy.
- 24. Nitin Gadkari, the Minister of Road Transport and Highways, introduced the world's first car powered by 100 percent Ethanol in New Delhi. This pioneering step aims to reduce carbon emissions, promote sustainable mobility, and decrease the nation's reliance on conventional fuel sources. Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep Singh Puri highlighted that implementing a 20 percent ethanol blend in petrol will result in annual savings of ₹35,000 crore in import bills for the country.
- 25. BJP President J P Nadda unveiled the coffee table book 'Sikhs and Modi (A Journey of Nine Years)' by Prabhleen Singh, published by the Outlook Group, in New Delhi. The book recognizes the teachings of Sikh Gurus, which have played a pivotal role in fostering unity, patriotism, and religious dedication in society. This marked the first-ever observance of 'Veer Bal Diwas' since Independence, commemorating the sacrifice of young sahibzade of Guru Gobind Singh for the unity and integrity of the nation.
- 26. NITI Aayog and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) formalized a cooperative framework through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to expedite India's progress toward achieving its sustainable development goals (SDGs). The collaboration focuses on various areas, including localizing SDGs and data-driven monitoring. NITI Aayog serves as the central institution for coordinating the adoption and monitoring of SDGs at both national and sub-national levels.
- 27. The government is set to launch a new scheme aimed at promoting research and innovation in the Pharma-Med Sector with a total budget of ₹5,000 crore. The primary objective is to transition the Indian Pharma-Med Tech sector from cost-based competitiveness to growth driven by innovation, bolstering research infrastructure within the country. This initiative seeks to boost drug manufacturing and stimulate research and innovation in the sector.

- 28. India and New Zealand have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to enhance cooperation in civil aviation in New Delhi. This agreement encompasses the scheduling of new routes, codeshare services, traffic rights, and capacity entitlement. New Zealand's designated airlines are granted the flexibility to operate services with various aircraft types, with third and fourth freedom traffic rights to and from six Indian points: New Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Chennai, Hyderabad, and Kolkata.
- 29. The Gujarat government has announced a 27 percent reservation for Other Backward Classes (OBCs) in local bodies such as panchayats, municipalities, and civic corporations. In Panchayats Extension to Scheduled Areas (PESA) notified regions, the reservation for OBCs will remain at 10 percent to safeguard tribal interests. The existing quotas for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes remain unchanged, and the 50 percent reservation limit has not been exceeded.
- 30. Umesh Revankar has been appointed as the new Chairman of the Finance Industry Development Council (FIDC). Currently serving as the Executive Vice Chairman of Shriram Finance, Umesh Revankar brings decades of experience and expertise in the financial services sector. He has advanced through the ranks, assuming various leadership roles in business operations and played a crucial role in establishing Shriram Transport Finance company as the largest commercial vehicle financer in India.
- 31. ISRO-Space Applications Centre (Ahmedabad) has successfully tested 'Nabhmitra,' a device designed for the safety of fishermen, at Neendakara. This satellite-based communication system enables two-way messaging between the sea and authorities, allowing for the transmission of weather and cyclone warnings in the local language. Fishermen can also send distress messages in case of emergencies such as capsizing or fires.
- 32. Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah has launched the 'Gruha Lakshmi' women's financial aid scheme in Mysuru. This initiative aims to provide ₹2,000 each to approximately 1.1 crore women who are heads of their families. The 'Gruha Lakshmi' scheme is one of the Congress party's pre-election 'guarantees' and has been allocated ₹17,500 crore in the current fiscal year.
- 33. The Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Fourth Partner Energy Private Limited have signed a long-term loan agreement of up to ₹1.2 billion to construct and operate a 25-megawatt solar photovoltaic-based power plant. This project aims to increase the supply of clean and cost-effective energy to commercial and industrial customers. The power plant, located in Tamil Nadu, is projected to generate approximately 50.7 gigawatt-hours of electricity annually, supplying power directly to commercial and industrial users.
- 34. Axis Bank has introduced the 'Infinity Savings Account,' a new savings account variant tailored for digitally savvy customers who frequently embrace subscription-based models. The account offers exclusive benefits such as waived Average Monthly Balance (AMB) requirements, complimentary debit cards, and the absence of domestic charges in exchange for a small monthly recurring fee of ₹150 or an annual fee of ₹1,650.
- 35. Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL) has produced India's first set of Catalysts for Selective Catalyst Reactors (SCR) designed to limit NOx emissions from thermal power plants. The inaugural set of SCR catalysts has been manufactured for use in the 5x800 MW Yadadri Thermal Power Station in Telangana. The manufacturing milestone was achieved at BHEL's Solar Business Division (SBD) unit in Bengaluru. BHEL stands as India's largest engineering and manufacturing company in its category.
- 36. Chandrayaan-3's Pragyan rover, developed by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), has confirmed the presence of sulphur in the lunar surface near the south pole. This groundbreaking discovery was made through the rover's Laser-Induced Breakdown Spectroscope, marking the first-ever in-situ measurements of lunar surface composition. The spectroscope also detected elements such as Aluminium, Calcium, Iron, Chromium, Titanium, Manganese, Silicon, and Oxygen as expected, with ongoing efforts to search for hydrogen.
- 37. India is set to host the inaugural 'Global IndiaAl 2023' in October 2023, organized by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology. This event will bring together leading Al experts, researchers, startups, and investors from India and around the world.
- 38. The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and the National Safai Karamcharis Finance and Development Corporation (NSKFDC) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the period of 2023-25. The aim is to uplift the socio-economic status of Safai Karamcharis and their dependents, focusing on empowering marginalized communities across the nation.
- 39. The renowned local products of Jammu and Kashmir, Bhaderwah Rajma, and Ramban Sulai Honey, have received the prestigious Geographical Indication (GI) Tag. The Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare,

- Jammu, initiated the GI Tagging process, which is expected to boost the economic well-being of local producers.
- 40. The Indian Army has signed contracts for the acquisition of 130 tethered drones and 19 tank-driving simulators under Emergency Procurement (EP). Tethered drones are unmanned aerial vehicles connected to the ground via a tether (cable) and will enhance the armed forces' capabilities.
- 41. NASA is launching a groundbreaking technology demonstration, the Integrated LCRD Low Earth Orbit User Modem and Amplifier Terminal (ILLUMA-T), to the Space Station. This initiative aims to improve space communication capabilities, and it will be launched on SpaceX's 29th Commercial Resupply mission.
- 42. Chandrayaan-3 has revealed a significant temperature difference between the moon's surface and a point approximately 8 cm below it. This information was gathered by an instrument called ChaSTE (Chandra's Surface Thermophysical Experiment) and shows valuable insights into lunar surface temperature variations.
- 43. The Textiles ministry has introduced the GREAT scheme (Grant for Research and Entrepreneurship across Aspiring Innovators in Technical Textiles) to promote innovation in technical textiles. The scheme provides grants of up to Rs 50 lakh for startups and individuals, fostering innovation in this specialized segment.
- 44. Chef Sanjeev Kapoor has been appointed as the brand ambassador for IndianOil's Indane XTRATEJ LPG brand. This announcement was made at the Indane XtraTej Hotelier Harmony Meet in Bengaluru, emphasizing Indian Oil's dedication to culinary innovation and efficiency.
- 45. The government plans to establish 1,000 Khelo India Centres across the country within a year. These centers will receive financial support for equipment procurement and operational expenses, aimed at promoting sports at the grassroots level.
- 46. The 'Awareness Campaign and Training of Trainers' initiative has been launched by Union Tribal Affairs Minister Arjun Munda to educate grassroots workers about sickle cell anemia, with the goal of eradicating the disease by 2047 under the National Sickle Cell Anaemia Elimination Mission.
- 47. Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan unveiled a unique comic book titled "Let's Move Forward" at Kaushal Bhawan, New Delhi. The book encourages students to prioritize holistic well-being, focusing on good health and wellness through storytelling.
